

Following the vote held in September 2017, the NAF Committee has decided that Bretonnians and Khorne will be added as races to the NAF database.

Tournaments will be allowed to include these as official races from 1st January 2018, but this will be up to the individual Tournament Organiser. The inclusion or exclusion of these races does not affect the sanctioning of a tournament.

Until this time the current situation will continue, which is that they can be included in tournaments but their games will not be recorded in the database.

The NAF Committee will at some point review whether they should become compulsory races for NAF sanctioning. No decision has been made on this.

FAQ

Q: Why is this being done now, as GW have re-released BB and these races are not included?

A: The discussion has been going on for a long time. Work is being done on the database and so this is now a technical possibility. addition BB2 Legendary has just been released with Bretonnians as part of it, so it looks as though they are here to stay. There are more games being played online than ever before, and it makes sense to . They are not as widely played as the other two races. be welcoming to online players.

Q: Why are they not being included immediately?

A: 800 people voted, which was 22.5% of the active members. 70% of voters voted for both to be included, with around 15% voting for neither to be included.

Q: What about Slann?

A: Slann are not affected. They remain a compulsory team for NAF sanctioning.

Q: What about the races in the App?

A: These will not be included.

Q: Now that these races are included, can we make other roster changes or change other rules?

A: No.

Q: Why were Simyins not part of the vote?

A: Simyins are played only on the League setting of Fumbbl.

· Q: The vote was described as advisory, why is it being treated as binding?

A: To allow time to get any database issues sorted and to allow. A: More members voted on this than have ever voted in a NAF election, with a clearer result than any election.

Q: I didn't know about the vote, why wasn't it publicised better?

A: It was in two NAF newsletters, on TFF, on Reddit, on Fumbbl, on the Cyanide forum, on NAF Facebook and Twitter as well as the BB Community Facebook group. All NTOs and RTOs were asked to spread the word locally as well.

Q: Was the vote more influenced by online players who joined to

A: During the month of September 2017 the NAF counted 116 new members (including 24 online sign-ups), of which only 30 participated in the vote, so this would not have altered the result.
